#### **Semester Registration Procedure**

For Spring 2025 registration, all currently enrolled graduate students will register online in the Student Information System (SONIS).

#### **Academic Advisement:**

- Advisement for Spring 2025 classes ends 10/4.
- All currently enrolled graduate students will receive an email with courses to register for in SONIS based on their plan of study.
- It is the student's responsibility to contact their Academic Advisor with questions or to make changes to their plan of study.
- Choose classes by checking the Spring 2025 Class Schedule for the classes you need and the time and location most convenient.
- The 'hold' on registration will be released by your Academic Advisor prior to your level's online registration dates.
- Students will not be able to register if they have delinquent financial obligations to the College or to financial aid programs.
- Class and clinical sections will be determined by registrations. The College reserves the
  right to limit enrollment in sections and to cancel a section for which there are insufficient
  registrations. The College reserves the right to change or adjust course and clinical or
  lab schedules of students, as needed. You will be notified of changes to your schedule
  via email.

#### **Registration and Student Account Implications:**

- To ensure timely receipt of billing statements and to make financial arrangements, please register as early as possible.
- Student Account payment for the Spring 2025 semester is due December 13, 2024.
- Students who register **after** the tuition/fee due date must make **immediate** payment arrangements in the Student Finance Office, Room 710.
- Students who register late and have an unpaid account balance by the tuition/fee due date may experience:
  - \* Delays in financial aid processing
  - \* \$25 monthly late charges on unpaid balance of account
  - \* Hold on class attendance
  - \* Unnecessary Stress!




#### **Minimum Technology Requirements**


All College of Nursing courses require the use of a computer and an .edu e-mail account. You may use the College's computer labs or your own personal computer. If you choose to use a personal computer, the minimum requirements can be found on the College of Nursing website.

#### **Online Registration Steps:**

Log in to the Student Information System (SONIS)







#### REGISTRATION IS COMPLETED. You can print a copy of your schedule.

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- 1. Other students will be registering at the same time. Course seats may fill up while you are in process.
- 2. If you finalize a course and need to switch courses (or sections), you will need to contact your Academic Advisor to email the Registrar your request. You will be emailed confirmation from the registrar when the switch has been made.

\*\*Please understand that we will try to place you in the courses and sections you have selected, but there are no guarantees. If you are placed in a different section for any reason, you will be notified of the change by email.

#### **Spring 2025 Course Offering:**

#### GRADUATE PROGRAMS

Graduate courses are online and offered in three (3) formats.

### ASYNC-Courses are asynchronous (students and faculty ARE NOT in the course at the same time) and do not meet live at all.

The asynchronous format allows students to access the course and make their contributions on their own schedule. While the course has due dates for assignments and discussions, none of the class is conducted live. The asynchronous format is delivered using the College's learning management system (LMS). All assignments, discussions etc. are in the LMS.

# HYBRID-Courses are mostly asynchronous (students and faculty ARE NOT in the course at the same time) but will meet *live* synchronously for some classes (students and faculty ARE IN the course at the same time) via a videoconferencing system during the first week and additional times during the semester.

The synchronous portion of the class allows students to attend class in a live "classroom" setting from the comfort of their home or office. The student's computer must have adequate Internet speed and be able to support the most current version of Adobe Flash Player. Students may need to purchase a webcam and microphone if these features are not built into the computer. Students are required to use an "appropriate headset" [USB connection, (instead of a jack), a noise cancelling microphone, and an inline mute/volume control] in all courses that use videoconferencing. Doing so will improve audio quality for everyone in the class and may also help each student focus more on the discussion since the headset can screen out ambient noise in the student's environment. Faculty will notify student of live meeting dates; questions about meeting dates should be directed to the faculty teaching the course.

The asynchronous portion of the class will be conducted using the College's learning management system (LMS).

## SYNC-Courses are synchronous (students and faculty ARE IN the course at the same time) and meet live each week via videoconferencing.

The synchronous option allows students to attend class in a live "classroom" setting from the comfort of their home or office. The student's computer must have adequate Internet speed and be able to support the most current version of Adobe Flash Player. Students may need to purchase a webcam and microphone if these features are not built into the computer. Students are required to use an "appropriate headset" [USB connection, (instead of a jack), a noise cancelling microphone, and an inline mute/volume control] in all courses that use videoconferencing. Doing so will improve audio quality for everyone in the class and may also help each student focus more on the discussion since the headset can screen out ambient noise in the student's environment.

**PRAC-Practicum courses are completed at a predetermined clinical site(s) with a preceptor(s).** Each practicum course requires completion of a different number of practicum hours. The number of required practicum hours is found in the course description located in the College Catalog which can be found at www.sfmccon.edu.

Times for courses are in Central Standard Time (CST).
